ACHILLEA (Yarrow)

Adaptable, easy to grow, drought tolerant plant that does best in well-drained soil. Long flowering and fernlike aromatic foliage.

ACONITUM (Monk's Hood)

Grows best when planted in partial shade, in moist, cool, fertile soil. Upright perennials with erect stems that bear hooded flowers. The roots, leaves and seeds are poisonous. Excellent for shady perennial borders. Good cut flowers.

AGASTACHE (Anise Hyssop)

Flowers mid-late summer, drought and heat resistant, full sun, well-drained soil. Great long lasting flowers. An underused perennial.

AJUGA (Carpet Bugle)

A rapid growing groundcover that proves effective under trees where lawn has difficulty establishing. Also does well in rock gardens and as an edging plant. Upright flower spikes.

 big, bold, bronze leaves with large 10-12" dark blue flowers. One of the largest ajugas. Spring. 12"
Ajuga x tenorii 'Chocolate Chip' **Chocolate Chip.....A**
 this unusual ajuga has rich, chocolate colored, small, narrow leaves. Blue flowers. Choice for small spaces or as an underplanting. Early spring 4"

Alchemilla mollis **Lady's Mantle.....A**
 an easy to grow evergreen ground cover with lobed leaves. Yellowish-green flowers in late spring, can be cut and dried. Late spring. 12-15"

Amsonia x 'Blue Ice' **Blue Ice.....A**
 Dark blue buds and flowers. Long-blooming, 5 weeks or more. Strong and compact. Dark green leaves turn yellow in fall. 12"-15"

ANEMONE (Windflowers)

Prefers full to partial sun and deep, moisture retentive soil. Provide good drainage. Outstanding plants when used in large groups. Good for background plantings in the perennial border.

Anemone h. 'September Charm' **September Charm.....B**
 single rose-pink flowers. Sept.–Oct. 24"

Anemone sylvestris **Snow Drop Anemone.....A**
 delicate, single white blooms over compact deep green foliage. Excellent ground cover. Part shade to shade. May-June. 8-12"

Anemone 'Hadspen Abundance' **Hadspen Abundance.....B**
 darkest single rose pink flowers, yellow center. Sept-Oct. 24"

Anemone 'Honorine Jobert' **Honorine Jobert.....B**
 single, pure white flowers. Very floriferous. Sept-Oct. 24-30"

Anemone 'Pamina' **Pamina.....B**
 semi-double purplish pink flowers. Sept-Oct 34"

Anemone x 'Queen Charlotte' **Queen Charlotte.....B**
 semi-double, light pink flowers. Sept.-Oct. 48"

AQUILEGIA (Columbine)

Graceful, colorful blossoms make this a delightful border plant. They delight in a well drained, rich humus soil, won't thrive in heavy, soggy soil. Sun or partial shade. Do not disturb mature plants.

Aquilegia x. 'Biedermeier Mix' **Columbine Biedermeier Mix.....A**
 an old fashioned favorite. Neat compact habit with a lovely array of mixed colors. Late spring. 8-10"

Artemisia schmidtiana 'Silver Mound' **Silver Mound.....A**
 a compact mounded plant. Fernlike silver-gray foliage. Excellent in the rock garden or for edging. Extremely popular foliage plant. 8-10"

ARUNCUS (Goatsbeard)

Feathery flowers and astilbe-like foliage. Fine border plants that do well along streams and ponds. Plant in sun to partial shade; rich, moist soil

Aruncus aethusifolius **Dwarf Goatsbeard.....B**
 clusters of tiny creamy white flowers and fine, shiny deep green fern-like foliage. Low growing. Excellent fall color. May-July. 8-12"

ASCLEPIAS (Butterfly Weed)

The Butterfly Milkweed plant, Asclepias, is a dramatic summer-blooming plant. They are sure to attract butterflies to a sunny part of the garden. They are important as both a host plant and a nectar source for these 'winged jewels'.

Asclepias incarnata 'Cinderella' Cinderella.....A
Small, rosy-red, orchid-like flowers with white centers. Summer-early fall. 36-40"

Asclepias tuberosa Butterfly Flower.....A
orange flowers. Full sun, well-drained soil. Upright perennial, lance-shaped leaves. Good for dry, sunny banks. Good cut flower. 18-24". July-August. Zone 3-9

ASTER (Hardy Aster)

Popular for late season flowers.

Aster dumosus 'Wood's Blue' Hardy Bushy Aster.....A
clear light blue flowers, compact dark green foliage. Attractive all summer. Very mildew and rust resistant. Late summer. 8-12"

Aster d. 'Wood's Pink' Bushy Aster.....A
clear pink flowers. Dark green foliage. Excellent resistance to mildew and rust. Late summer. 12-16"

Aster d. 'Wood's Purple' Bushy Aster.....A
purple semi-double flowers. Compact habit

Aster lateriflorus 'Lady in Black' Calico Aster.....A
deep red purple foliage provides a stately addition to the garden throughout the season. Smoky pink blooms Sept-Oct. 3'

ASTILBE (False Goat's Beard, False Spirea)

These elegant summer flowering plants are perfect for moist soils. Their airy plumes add a regal appearance to the woodland garden. Some flower clusters are stiff and upright, others more open, still others cascade outward. The foliage varies from green, to bronze or red. Plant in partial shade and organically rich, moist soil. Excellent plant for a shady border. Flower best in light shade, not as prolific in full shade. Can be grown in sun with adequate moisture.

Arendsii group-a group of hybrids developed by famed German nurseryman George Arends.

The majority of all astilbes sold in USA are of these crosses.

Astilbe arendsii 'Amethyst' Amethyst.....A
long and airy dark lilac plumes, tolerant of sun in a moist area. 30-35"

Astilbe a. 'Bressingham Beauty' Bressingham Beauty.....A
a Bloom's of Bressingham selection. Salmon-pink. Tall arching plumes. Mid flowering. 36-42"

Astilbe a. 'Bridal Veil' Bridal Veil.....A
Classic white. Lacey white panicles gently droop at the end giving a frothy look to the clump. Deep green glossy foliage. June. 28"

Astilbe a. 'Bumalda' Bumalda.....A
one of the best whites available. It beautifully contrasts with the reddish stems. June-July. 20-25"ht.

Astilbe a. 'Fanal' Fanal.....A
deep blood red narrow spikes. Mahogany foliage in spring changing to green by summer. A most popular red. June-July. 20".

Astilbe a. 'Snowdrift' Snowdrift.....A
clean white flowers on wide, feathery plumes. Bright green foliage. A Blooms of Bress. June-July. 24"

Astilbe (continued)

chinensis species--a later blooming species useful for extending the bloom season into late summer. Foliage is deeply incised, coarsely textured, and often bronze-green. Flowers borne on narrow branched panicles. Moderately drought tolerant, but superior performance in moist soil. Shorter varieties make excellent groundcovers.

Astilbe chinensis 'Maggie Daley' Maggie Daley.....A
bright lavender-purple plumes are dense and fuzzy. Shiny, dark green foliage attractive even when not in bloom. July-Aug. 28"

Astilbe c. 'Visions' Visions.....A
purple flowers, sun tolerant. Very vigorous grower that can stand the sun and drought better than any other astilbe. July- August. 12-15"

Astilbe c. 'Visions in Pink' Visions in Pink.....B
robust grower, drought tolerant, long lasting true pink plumes. US PP# 11.860 PP# EU 7359 July-August. 20-24"

Astilbe c. 'Visions in Red' Visions in Red.....B
the darkest red flower plumes available within the *chinensis* species. US PP#11.965 July-Aug 15-20"

Japonica group - Noted for early bloom time and glossy green leaves which are often tinged with red. Leaves are narrow, sharply toothed, and pyramidal shaped. Flowers are produced in dense, pyramidal clusters.

Astilbe japonica 'Deutschland' Deutschland.....A
Pure white, open, lacy panicles. Bold glossy, deep green foliage. June. 24'-30"

Astilbe j. 'Montgomery' Montgomery.....A
dark red plumes. Reddish stems and foliage. Best red variety. Mid/late. 24"

Astilbe j. 'Red Sentinel' Red Sentinel.....B
Vibrant scarlet-red flowers held in open, lacy panicles. Forest green foliage and mahogany-red stems. One of the best reds. June-July. 20"-24"

Astilbe j. 'Rheinland' Rheinland.....A
profuse pink bloomer with short, full plumes. June- July. 24"

Astilbe j. 'Washington' Washington.....A
pure white. One of the best whites, earliest to bloom. Early/mid blooming. 24"

Simplicifolia group - compact mounds with good looking glossy, mid-green lobed leaves, not divided. Open airy panicles turn to ornamental seed heads. Very susceptible to drought.

Astilbe simplicifolia 'Aphrodite' Aphrodite.....A
carmine-red plumes, dark bronze foliage. Mid/late blooming. 14-16"

Astilbe s. 'Hennie Graafland' Hennie Graafland.....A
rose plumes, very uniform. Extremely glossy foliage. A sister to 'Sprite'. Has taller flower plumes. July- August. 16"

Astilbe s. 'Jacqueline' Jacqueline.....A
large pure pink plumes, dark green foliage. Improved Hennie Graafland. Mid/late blooming. 18-22"

Astilbe s. 'Key Biscayne' Key Biscayne.....B
A NEW seedling of 'Sprite' with fuller, light pink flowers and reddish stems. Unique two-tone green foliage with a dark red edge. Use in garden or containers. July-Aug. 14"-16"

Astilbe s. 'Sprite' Sprite.....A
pink plumes, bronze green foliage. **PPA Plant of The Year 1994!** August-Sept. 10-12"

Astilbe s. 'Touch of Pink' Touch of Pink.....B
white with a touch of pink. Profuse bloomer. US PP#11.960. (CAN PPAF) July-Aug. 15-20"

Astilbe (continued)

Thunbergii group—a group of late blooming hybrids with distinctive open, nodding flower clusters held on tall stems above the glaucous foliage.

Astilbe thunbergii ‘Straussenfeder’ **Ostrich Plume.....A**
tall, long, loosely branched, cascading salmon-pink nodding plumes. July-Aug. 35-40”


Baptisia ‘australis’ **False Indigo.....B**
upright shrub-like habit. Indigo-blue flowers on long terminal racemes blooms mid- to late spring with gray-green stems and blue- green leaves. Black seed pods. **PPA Plant of The Year 2010!** 3-4’

Baptisia ‘Carolina Moonlight’ **Carolina Moonlight.....B**
elegant creamy yellow spikes. Tidy blue green foliage. Long blooming, tough. Early Summer. 3’

Baptisia ‘Purple Smoke’ **Purple Smoke.....B**
smoky violet flowers, purple eye. Charcoal stems with gray-green foliage. When mature can bear over 50 blooming stalks in the spring. Grows to 4’

BERGENIA (Saxifraga, Pig Squeak)

The attractive cabbage-like foliage makes a very decorative groundcover, border or rockery plant. Showy blooms appear from mid to late spring and survive early morning frost.

 **Bergenia cordifolia ‘Winterglow’** **Winterglow.....B**
Large thick leathery evergreen foliage. Contrasting bright red flower clusters on heavy stems. Glossy leaves turn reddish-bronze in fall and winter. 12-15”

Bergenia saxifraga x ‘Perfect’ **Perfect.....B**
rosy-red flowers. Red-brown leaves, strong stems. 12-18”

Bergenia ‘Pink Dragonfly’ **Pink Dragonfly..... B***
bright pink flowers. Narrow leaves with bright purple winter color. Tiny gem, multi-season drama. 12”

BRUNNERA (Heartleaf Alkanet)

Brunnera prefers moist soil. For the shady border or open woodlands. A good groundcover.

Brunnera macrophylla **Brunnera.....B**
Brunnera for woodland settings, performing best in partial shade. Spring . 12”

Brunnera m. ‘Jack Frost’ **Jack Frost Brunnera..... C***
heart shaped frosty silver foliage with light green veins and edging. Clusters of ‘forget-me-not’ like flowers PPAF. April-May 10-15”

Brunnera m. ‘Looking Glass’ **Looking Glass.....D**
Shimmering silver leaves. Sport of ‘Jack Frost’ with less prominent veins. Glows! Masses of blue ‘forget-me-not’ flowers in Spring. PPAF Clumps are 5” wide and 12” height.

Brunnera m. ‘Variegata’ **variegated Brunnera..... B***
variegated leaves with large clear, white edges. Blue flowers. Intolerant of drought. May-July. 10-15”

BUDDLEIA (Butterfly Bush)

A deciduous shrub that is the backbone of the late summer perennial garden. Easy to grow. Narrow branches support lilac-like clusters of blossoms that can vary from a foot or two in length. Butterflies, bees, and hummingbirds flock to the honey scented blossoms. Prune back early spring.

Buddleia davidii ‘Black Knight’ **Black Knight.....B**
dark purple flowers on long trusses. Hardy and vigorous. Late summer. 5-7’.

Buddleia d. ‘Pink Delight’ **Pink Delight.....B**
pure pink flowers in thick 15” long racemes. Compact habit, nice silver foliage. Award Winner, 5-7’

- Calamintha grandiflora 'Variegata'** **Calamint.....A**
 Pink-lavender blooms on green, upright leaves spattered with cream. Easy, compact, bushy. 15"-18"
- Calamintha nepeta 'Blue Cloud'** **Calamint.....A**
 trouble-free plant, mint-scented foliage. Tiny tubular, pale lavender-blue flowers on 3" spike above foliage. Heat & drought tolerant once established. Spring to summer and reblooms Sept. 12-15"
- Calamintha n. 'White Cloud'** **White Calamint.....A**
 Swarms of petite white flowers that look like small mouths. Blooms spring until summer and reblooms in Sept. Dark Green foliage is fragrant when brushed. Drought tolerant. 18"

CAMPANULA (Bellflower)

Plant in sun to partial shade; slightly alkaline well-drained soil. Attractive border plants with bell-shaped blooms. Taller varieties are good for cut flowers. Lower growing varieties are good for edging, rock gardens and containers.

- Campanula carpicata 'Blue Clips'** **Blue Clips.....A**
 light green leaves. Large violet- blue cup-shaped flowers. Late spring to early fall. 8"
- Campanula c. 'White Clips'** **White Clips.....A**
 dainty white flowers cups smother the foliage over a long season. Summer. 8"
- Campanula p. 'Blue Waterfall'** **Serbian Bellflower..... B***
 a Bloom's of Bressingham selection. Dark blue, bell shaped flowers over cascading foliage. A mass of color, drought tolerant. Great front border plant. PPAF June-July. 8-10"
- Campanula 'Pink Octopus'** **Pink Octopus.....C**
 Japanese lantern buds open to tons of pink, octopus-like flowers that hang down from upright branches. Strong, deeply cut foliage. Unique! Long blooming, easy, tolerant. PPAF June-July. 10-15"

- Centaurea montana** **Persian Cornflower, Mountain Bluet.....A**
 Unique violet blue flowers with fringed margins. Easy, long lasting. Deadhead for extended bloom and to reduce self-seeding. Requires frequent division in small gardens. Late Spring- Mid Summer. 24"

- Centranthus ruber 'Coccineus'** **Red Valerian.....A**
 tiny carmine-rose florets cluster in dense showy heads held above bushy gray-green foliage. exceptionally long bloom season. Summer. 24-36"

- Cerastium tomentosum 'Yo Yo'** **Yo Yo Snow in Summer.....A**
 white flowers, gray foliage. Low mounding groundcover. Heat tolerant. May-June. 4-6"


- Ceratostigma plumbago** **Plumbago.....A**
 vivid dark blue flowers. Green foliage turns reddish in the fall. Breaks dormancy late. Late summer. 8"

- Chelone lyonii 'Hot Lips'** **Pink Turtlehead.....A**
 Brilliant rose pink turtle head shaped flowers on lustrous, deep green foliage. Red stems persist most of season. Also, early season growth is a nice bronze green. Aug-Sept. 2'-3'

CIMICIFUGA (syn. Actaea) (Bugbane)

Prefers partial shade, needs constant moisture in full sun. Deep humus soil. Perfect for the back of the perennial or woodland garden.

- Cimicifuga romosa 'Atropurpurea'** **Snakeroot.....C**
 ivory white flowers which contrast beautifully with the attractive purple foliage and stems. Superb specimen plant. 50-60". August- Oct.
- Cimicifuga r. 'Brunette'** **Brunette.....D**
 deep purple foliage with creamy white flowers. Aug-Oct. 50-60"

-  **Cimicifuga r. 'James Compton'** **James Compton.....D**
 Shortest, most compact form. Very dark purple foliage, like Brunette. Fragrant white flowers. 36-42"
- Cimicifuga r. 'Pink Spike'** **Pink Spike.....D**
 dark bronze black foliage with soft pink flowers. Aug.-Oct. 4-5'
- Cimicifuga 'Black Negligee'** **Black Negligee.....D**
 Lacy black foliage, dark stems. Purple-tinted white flowers reach up 2'. Exotic grape and jasmine scent. Can take full sun with lots of water for darkest coloring, or use in part shade. 4-5'

COREOPSIS (Tickseed)

Summer-long color. Showy addition to the perennial border, wildflower garden or naturalizing. Full sun, well drained medium rich soil.

- Coreopsis auriculata 'Nana'** **Mouse Ear.....A**
 dwarf yellow. Compact, glossy, deep green foliage. Flowers May-June then intermittent until frost. 9"
- Coreopsis vericillata 'Crème Brulee'** **Crème Brulee.....B**
 soft yellow flowers with bright green threadlike foliage. Flowers all summer into fall. Vigorous grower. very showy ! PPAF Blooms of Bressingham 16-20"
- Coreopsis v. 'Moonbeam'** **Moonbeam.....A**
 upright perennial with linear, threadlike deep green leaves and daisy-shaped, creamy lemon yellow flowers. PPA Plant of the Year 1992! Summer 18"
- Coreopsis v. 'Zagreb'** **Zagreb.....A**
 a delightful golden-yellow dwarf with finely cut foliage. 15". Summer.
-  **Coreopsis 'Redshift' –Big Bang™ Series** **Redshift.....A**
 Creamy yellow 2 inch flowers with red eye. Flowers that open after cool nights range in color from solid red to yellow with red streaked petals. Foliage is almost threadlike. PPAF 30-36". July-Sept.

- Corydalis 'Blackberry Wine'** **Corydalis..... B***
 arching stems topped with fragrant, plum-violet flowers contrast nicely against blue-green lacey white-edged leaves. Very long blooming. Late spring-mid fall. 24"
- Corydalis elata** **Blue False Bleeding Heart.....C**
 blue, richly perfumed flowers, similar to gardenias, last a long time. From China. Loves heat. 15"

- Crocsmia 'Emberglow'** **Montbretia Emberglow.....A**
 arching burnt orange flowers above sword-shaped leaves. July-Aug. 24-36"
- Crocsmia 'Emily McKenzie'** **Emily McKenzie.....A**
 open, flat-faced orange flowers with maroon markings in center. Purple stems. Aug-Sept. 30"
- Crocsmia 'George Davidson'** **George Davidson.....A**
 clear midsummer yellow flowers on slender but strong stems good for cutting. July-Aug. 24-36"
- Crocsmia 'Lucifer'** **Montbretia Lucifer.....A**
 broad sword-like foliage. Brilliant flame-red flowers. Good cut flower. Hardest. Summer. 36-42"

- Delosperma nubigenum** **Hardy Ice Plant.....A**
 hardiest. Zone 5. Yellow blooms early summer. Thick, succulent, rich-green foliage. height 2-3"

DELPHINIUM (Larkspur)

A distinct class of border perennials. Elatum have tall, dignified stately spikes, strong stems with magnificent heavily-petalled flowers. Grandiflorum are short (dwarf) bushy mounds of lacy leaves with loose panicles of blossoms nearly all summer. These can be short-lived but can re-seed. Delphiniums prefer evenly moist garden soil..

DIANTHUS (Pinks)


- Dianthus gratianopolitanus 'Baths Pinks'** Baths Pinks..... A
pink, low mounding. 6-8"
- Dianthus g. 'Firewitch'** Firewitch..... A
brilliant magenta, clove scented blooms top silvery-blue foliage. PPA Plant of the Year 2006!
Late spring. 7-8"
- Dianthus g. 'Mountain Mist'** Mountain Mist..... A
blue-green foliage. Single pink, lightly fragrant flowers. Evergreen. 12"
- Dianthus 'Eastern Star'** Eastern Star..... A
Large, velvety red flowers with raisin-red centers and wisps of soft pink along edges. Spicy clove fragrance. Evergreen, glaucous blue-green foliage. Compact mound. PPAF June & Sept. 7"
- Dianthus 'Neon Star'** Neon Star..... B
fluorescent pink flowers. Spicy clove fragrance. Evergreen, glaucous blue-gray foliage forms compact mound. PP14549-Star Series. Perpetual flowering early summer-early fall. 7"

DICENTRA (Bleeding Heart)

Prefers partial shade and well-drained humus soil. Nice in borders and woodland gardens. Early blooming. Some newer cultivars are ever-blooming, (i.e. they do not go summer dormant.)

- Dicentra formosa 'King of Hearts'** King of Hearts..... B*
deep rosy pink true heart-shaped flowers and finely cut soft grayish-blue foliage. Ever blooming. May-August. 10"
- Dicentra f. 'Luxuriant'** Luxuriant..... B
cherry red flowers, ferny green foliage, tolerates more sun/ heat. Ever blooming. 12-15" May-August.
- Dicentra spectabilis** Bleeding Heart..... A
Old-fashioned bleeding heart. Drooping chains of red to pink heart-shaped flowers with white center on arching branches. Summer dormant. April-May. 20-30"
- Dicentra s. 'Alba'** white Bleeding Heart..... A
graceful arching stems with white flowers. 20-30" April-May
-  **Dicentra s. 'Gold Heart'** Gold Heart..... N/A
Stunning, brilliant gold foliage in spring. Rosy-pink flowers. Part shade for best color. PPAF 24-30"
-  **Dicentra 'Burning Hearts'** Burning Hearts..... B*
A fantastic fern-leaved bleeding heart! Striking rose-red flowers with a white edge. Blooms all season on top of a compact blue-gray, finely textured mound of foliage. Won't go dormant if given adequate moisture. PPAF May-Sept. 10-12"

DIGITALIS (Foxglove)

- Digitalis grandiflora 'Crème Brulee'** Crème Brulee Foxglove..... A
Creamy yellow flowers. 12"-18"
- Digitalis mertonensis** Foxglove..... A
dignified spikes of tubular flowers colored like crushed strawberries. Good border plant. Early summer. 36"
- Digitalis purpurea 'Camelot Rose'** Camelot Rose..... A
Rose. 3-4'
-  **Digitalis 'Dalmation Purple'** Dalmation Purple..... A
Deep lavender purple flowers with a heavily spotted maroon throat. First year flowering perennial. Strong growth habit. 2-3' June

ECHINACEA (Coneflower)

TIARELLA (Foamflower)

Tiarellas are on a tidal wave of popularity thanks to their shade tolerance and early bloom season. Unusual leaf shapes, dramatically marked foliage, repeat flowering and light fragrance make a terrific underplanting for hostas and shrubs, or along shaded walkways. Thrives in a cool shaded area.

Tiarella 'Mystic Mist' **Mystic Mist..... B***

TRICYRTIS (Japanese Toad Lily)

Graceful arching ladder-like leaves that alternate up the stems. Orchid-like flowers start late in the season lightening up the shade garden after everything else is done. Prefers partial shade and well drained soil. Attractive plant for the perennial border.

- Pennisetum a. 'Little Honey'** Little Honey..... B
similar to 'Little Bunny' but variegated form. 8-10"ht.

 A new improvement over the species. Brighter gray-blue foliage and red-orange fall color. Fluffy, silver seed heads. Narrow, upright habit. Will grow in hot, dry sites where other plants cannot. Aug. 3'

VINES – call for availability

Climbing vines not only lead the eye above the garden floor but also can add vibrant colors and a textured foliage to the landscape. Most vines need proper support in the landscape unless they are being used as a groundcover.

Twining vines like Actinidia wind their stems around trellises, branches, string. These are great for use on chainlink fences, light poles, trellises

Clinging vines like Campsis radicans, Euonymus types, Hydrangea, Parthenocissus and Schizophragma attach themselves by aerial rootlets or adhesive disks, clinging to large trees, masonry, rough surfaces.

Tendrils and Leaf Stalk vines like Clematis and Lathyrus need smaller supports like netting, small slats on trellises

- Lonicera sempervirens 'Blanche Sandman'** **Blanche Sandman Honeysuckle..... B***
 Deep rose flowers open to light yellow in late May, then off and on until frost. Longest bloomer. Brings hummingbirds to the garden. Sun. 15'
- Polygonum aubertii** **Silver Lace Vine..... C**
 covered with foamy sprays of white flowers. One of the fastest growing perennial vine. Requires warm, sunny location, full sun to part shade. Summer. 20'

CLEMATIS-call for availability


One of the most popular climbing vines. Irresistible beautiful, indispensable. Use them to liven up an small space by growing them on fences, arbors, pergolas, obelisks. As far as pruning care, clematis fall into three Groups:

Group 1-early flowering cultivars. This group flowers in the spring on old wood. They generally do not need pruning. If needed, trim back within one month after flowering. Old woody plants can be cut back to 1'-2', but may take 1-2 seasons to start re-flowering..

Group 2-early to midseason flowering and rebloomers. This group begins flowering early summer. Prune in late winter or early spring. Cut at 6-9" above well-developed buds. Be selective! First flowers are on the old wood, second flush of flowers are on new growth for this group.

Group 3- late flowering cultivars. Both flushes of blooms are on new growth; in midsummer and then in early fall. To rejuvenate, prune late winter or early spring, cutting all shoots back to the previous year's wood, just above the base of the plant. This must be done for this group to avoid a bare stem with a thick tangle above it. No flowers that spring. Or rejuve in stages over 3 years.

Small-flowered Clematis do not need to be pruned regularly. Only cut back if they outgrow their space
